## **Examiner's Note on the Programme:**

In light of several representations it is important to note the limitations imposed by the legislation on the scope of the examination. The examination is required to consider whether:

- The Council has complied with all legal and procedural requirements in preparing the draft charging schedule;
- The draft charging schedule is supported by appropriate available evidence, including the actual and expected costs of infrastructure and economic viability of the area;
- The proposed charging rates are informed by, and consistent with, the evidence;
- The evidence shows that the proposed rates would not put at risk the overall development of the area as proposed in the relevant development plan; and
- The draft charging schedule includes an appropriate map.

It is not the function of the examination to scrutinise the Council's Regulation 123 list (the infrastructure list), other than to consider the list as part of the evidence of a potential infrastructure funding gap. Additionally, the examination is not required to consider governance arrangements once a levy is in place, including neighbourhood apportionments, instalment policies or discretionary relief.
