Appendix 1 – Graffiti Enforcement Process

Awareness Letter • would provide commercial premises with a 'low level' awareness letter providing the details of the location of the graffiti, the graffiti removal service the Council provides and next step if no action takes place

Community Protection Warning • send a CPW to the land/property owner advising the graffiti needs to be removed within a set period of time, i.e. 14days

Community Protection Notice • If no action has been taken a CPN may be issued requiring removal of the graffiti

Issue FPN

• If the works have not been completed then issue with a FPN of £100 to the property / land owner and if remains unpaid consider enforcement action.

Works in Defaults • If the graffiti has still not been removed then and order the removal or for MBC to remove and recover cost could be sought on prosecution.

Prosecution

• prosecution could be considered depending on the nature of the graffiti i.e. offensive, size, how long its been there.
